Turn Left at the Big Anthill A Book Review

Turn Left at the Big Anthill is a new book written by **Rosemary (Ingold) Manchester, A49**. It details her life as the young wife of a Methodist missionary in the Congo.

Rosemary's book has a clear-eyed view of the life of a missionary family in the 1950's in the midst of the juxtaposition of old-line values and attitudes with a rapidly and dramatically changing world. We can actually see the last vestiges of colonialism and the emergence of a new independent Africa. This book gives us insight without pushing a point of view, and it holds the reader in from start to finish.

Independence when it came to the Congo wasn't a single moment. It was, in fact, messy, at times brutal and often lacking in a common vision. Through all of this a missionary family that

ultimately included four young children worked to bring Christianity into this turmoil.

Changes in government weren't the only changes detailed in the book. The reader gets to watch Rosemary's push for an equal partnership in her marriage and to follow her battle for what is best for her family as she struggles with entrenched attitudes in both the church's governing board in New York and in her missionary husband. She gets to know individuals, both white and black, who find themselves in a rapidly changing, sometimes difficult to understand world.

This engrossing book works on many levels. It is available in both paperback and Kindle from Amazon and other fine booksellers. I highly recommend it.

After taking a break from her career to raise her children, she worked as secretary to a patent attorney and then as advanced engineering secretary until her retirement. She is survived by a daughter, **Gwen (Hill) Threadgill, A71**. She is also survived by a son, 2 stepsons, 5 grandchildren and 5 step grandchildren. She had eight great-grandchildren.

Dr. Perry U. Hunsley, A51 & N50, of Salina, KS passed away April 2022 at age 93. After leaving C of E with both a nursing degree from the Newman School of Nursing and a BS from C of E, he went on to graduate from the University of Kansas Medical School. He then practiced family medicine in Kansas before moving to Ohio to complete his surgical residency at Akron General Medical Center. Later he moved to Branson, MO, where he served as Chief of Surgery at Skaggs Community Health Center until his retirement. Four children, ten grandchildren and two great-grandchildren survive him. His wife, **Phyllis (Hamme) Hunsley, N50**, and a son predeceased him.

George Akahane, A51, of Waipahu, HI passed away March 2019 at age 89. His wife preceded him in death. He was survived by 5 children, 10 grandchildren and 5 great grandchildren.

Yolanda (Greco) Deal, X52, of Urbana, IL passed away September 2019 at age 88. She completed her education at Washburn University, earning a teaching certificate. As an innovative public school Spanish teacher, she developed a pioneering culture-based curriculum to teach Spanish to children using music and folklore. She also co-directed an inaugural study abroad program with the University of Costa Rica, which has become the longest-running continuous exchange of its kind. Three sons, four grandchildren and her sister, **Geneve (Greco) Owensby, X54**, survive her. Her husband predeceased her.

William "Bill" Danenhauer, A56, of Bella Vista, AK passed away July 2021 at age 87. At C of E Bill was an NAIA Football All-American

in both 1953 and 1955. He has been inducted into the C of E Athletic Hall of Fame. He was drafted by the Baltimore Colts and later played for the Denver Broncos and the New England Patriots. In Denver his brother **Eldon Danenhauer, X57**, was his teammate. After his playing career, Bill moved on into coaching, eventually becoming head coach at University of Nebraska Omaha. He then moved on to scouting positions for the NFL. His wife, 4 children, 11 grandchildren and 17 great-grandchildren survive him. His sister, both brothers and an infant son predeceased him.

Elena (Miro) Dyche, A57, of Topeka passed away December 2021 at age 85. Elena married **Jerry Dyche, A60**. They later divorced. Elena grew up in Cuba and became an American citizen in 1961. Her entire thirty-year elementary school teaching career was in Topeka schools. Three grandsons survive her. She was preceded in death by her brother and her son.

Dennis A. Vaughan, X60, of Chanute, KS passed away December 2021 at age 82. His career was in pipelining. He was a certified pipeline welder and pipefitter. His career took him across the entire United States plus work on the Alaskan Pipeline and in Saudi Arabia. He is survived by his wife, 5 children, 12 grandchildren and 13 great-grandchildren.

Dr. Samuel J. Zeakes, A66, of Radford, VA passed away June 2022 at age 77. After C of E Bill received a graduate teaching fellowship at Kansas State where he received both his M.S. and Ph.D. in Parasitology. This, in turn, led him to his teaching career. He taught at the collegiate level for over 40 years in three states. He received "Excellence in Teaching" awards at both Marymount College in Salina, KS and Radford University in Virginia. In 1994 he was named a "Virginia Master Teacher" by the state of Virginia. His wife, two children and four granddaughters survive him.

Dr. Jesse R. Wood, FF, of Topeka, KS passed away July 2022 at age 89. After earning his Ph.D. in Chemistry from the University of Michigan he came to Kansas and taught

Another Man's Shoes

A Book Review

David C. Page, A71, has written a book about a series of reconstructed conversations with his friend Gordon, who spends most of his life in a wheelchair following a serious automobile accident. The book is honest. It portrays real events in the lives of the two friends.

We live with both friends through selected moments of their lives. In fact, there is a chapter entitled *The College of Emporia* where David met his future wife, **Therese "Terry" (Nyce) Page, A74**.

The reader learns a lot about David in the book, including his version of why he asked Terry to marry him. The conversations with Gordon reflect

how a bond of brotherhood develops between two bright individuals, one bound to a wheelchair and the other widely traveled. Don't assume that this book is about pathos. Plenty of humor and real-world stories can be found in these pages. In fact, there may be moments in this book that cause you to laugh out loud.

At the end of the book, the reader will be rooting for the two principal characters and will feel that these two individuals are known personally. It's a difficult book to put down. I read it in two days. It's recommended. You will find it at Amazon and other fine booksellers.
